Diploma Requirements:

Successful completion of the PASS program will lead to a high school diploma from Wareham Public Schools.

The requirements needed for graduation, 100 credits along with the core academics:

- 4 English courses
- 4 Mathematics courses
- 3 Science courses
- 3 Social Science courses
- 1 Wellness course

Additionally, all students must pass ELA, Mathematics, and Science/Technology MCAS tests.

Registration fee of \$50.00 for all students.

All seniors are required to pay a \$50 graduation fee.


